COWICHAN VALLEY - Starting on Earth Day April 22 to 24, 2021 local community groups and municipalities will be working together from a distance to **#CleanCowichan2021**.

"Clean Where You Are" campaign suggests you clean in your neighbourhood, when you are out for a walk, in a park, or on your favourite trail with your 'bubble'. Take a bag, one glove, long tongs, and go pick up!

Depending on your jurisdiction, you may pick up an additional free garbage tag (limited quantities available) from one of these locations:

- City of Duncan: City Hall, 200 Craig Street Duncan on April 22 & 23, 8:30 am 4:00 pm
- Municipality of North Cowichan: 7030 Trans-Canada Highway, on April 22 & 23, 8:30 am 4:00 pm

The additional bag needs to be in another can/container to be picked up on your scheduled day.
