

On behalf of Council, I am pleased to introduce the 2023-2026 Duncan Strategic Plan. Building on our work to date, this new strategic planning cycle represents an opportunity to refocus our efforts on the key priorities that will further our collective vision to continue to create a thriving, vibrant, and livable City.

When we talk about cities, we are really talking about people. Cities are places to connect with one another, to form and strengthen relationships with our friends, neighbours, and colleagues. In our downtown, we can find heritage features that remind us of the past alongside vibrant cultural symbols that speak to the future we want for our community. Downtown Duncan is the heart of the Cowichan Valley, a point of community connection that celebrates this beautiful place we all call home through the vibrancy found in culture, art, music, events, and a thriving business community. Council will continue to work to preserve and enhance Downtown Duncan through initiatives such as the upcoming Station Street Placemaking Project, for which community members of all ages came together to design an outstanding public space for residents and visitors to gather.

Working under the guidance of a committee led by Cowichan Tribes Elders, who developed Hul'qumi'num signage for downtown, the first of two reconciliation murals has been installed with the support of City Council. We are committed to continuing the work of truth and reconciliation in all forms - using United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples as a framework – as we move forward with projects and initiatives at the local and regional level.


In Duncan, we embrace the fact that we are small – in a BIG way. The City's compact size works to our advantage in multiple ways, including by making it more affordable to deliver utility and transportation infrastructure to residents and businesses. By supporting sustainable development, the City can increase the supply of housing in Duncan while also ensuring that new developments contribute in a positive way to community aesthetics, placemaking, biodiversity, active transportation, and local climate change resiliency.

Making space that meets the needs of all members of our community is an important part of continuing to establish a City that is caring, inclusive, and accessible. Council recently endorsed the Duncan Accessibility Plan that represents our commitment to continuously improve our policies, practices, and built environment, which impacts residents, businesses, and visitors alike. The Duncan Accessibility Plan aligns with work we are doing in our parks to improve accessibility. The new McAdam Park playground and reconstructed Centennial Park play structure will be fantastic amenities for children and families of all ages and abilities to come and enjoy.

The priorities outlined in the 2023-2026 Strategic Plan will guide Council's work over the coming years. We invite you to review the Plan and engage with us as we work to make the City of Duncan the most livable small City in Canada.


