Dear City Council,

Recently I learned through a friend whose child attends Cowichan Preschool that the city has intentions to put a Homeless Warming shelter within the boundaries of McAdam Park. I listened to her concerns and felt whole heartedly that she was absolutely justified in those feelings. To increase homeless foot traffic in this area would be detrimental to this neighbourhood, the school and the athletic community here in North Cowichan/Duncan. Recently the school had concerns that children may come into contact with drug paraphernalia within its playground bounds. Their teacher and parents have to take an active role in sweeping the grounds to ensure that their children are safe, as they should be at school. This honestly shouldn't be a responsibility or concern of any parents in our community and just shows that changes need to be made in regards to homelessness, drug abuse and alcoholism. The school had to have a fence built that's kept locked at all times which has taken a play ground away from the community for after hours use. I just read an article about the Cowichan Valley scoring 41 out of the top 200 or so communities in regards to crime. This is truly disheartening to know, as I grew up in a safe community where I could walk home from school without fear and play sports in our fields without concern. One day when I have children, I would like to know that I'm raising them in a safe community, in the current state we may have to look elsewhere.

I grew up playing soccer on the lower field at McAdam Park. Soccer season runs from September to the spring (or it did 15 years ago), where my parents felt comfortable letting us walk down to the park around 5:30pm which during this time frame the skies are dark. Could you imagine any parent being comfortable to allow their child to walk to their organized team sport right past a homeless warming shelter through a dark bridge path to the lower fields? No. By placing a warming shelter in this area you are cutting off the independence, freedom, and especially the safety of all our children and families using this park. The park has recently been updated with new grass & lights. What was the point of doing those upgrades and using tax payer's money, if you were just going to place undesirable people right in the path to get there? Our parks and recreational lands should be used for only that, recreation and sports. They are there for our children to learn and grown while participating in sports and activities and to keep their minds and body healthy and strong. Don't take away their freedoms to play and enjoy their childhoods.

I am a dog owner and the kind that absolutely loves her dog like a child. When we first got her 4 years ago we took her to McKinstry dog park to learn how to socialize, interact and swim. We met many dog and people friends down there and would often spend hours walking, relaxing and enjoying the company of others. As she continued to grow we continued to go there but noticed an increase in people using the area as residence. We found trash, abandoned sleeping items, food and the worst was human excrement. For the safety of our dog we decided to no longer use this facility. Our community already suffers from a lack of housing and drug abuse, why do we want to attract those individuals to a highly residential area within our community. This just seems unplanned and poorly thought out. If you want your community residents to use the facilities and parks as intended then stop proposing homeless outreach programs within these areas.

Why not consider a long term plan like building another smaller outbuilding on the current Warmland shelter property to use as showers and warming. I understand the need to provide this service and I understand that Warmland is often at capacity for residence, but it would make sense to keep all of these services close. Again, unfortunately the building was build right between 2 schools and

in a residential area, but it's already there, it's already decreased property values, so why not just keep it all centralized. At the same time, I believe the proposition of a needle exchange should also be in this area where people who use often frequent, but that's another battle.

In the end, I vote NO for the proposed warming site and hope that city council heeds the concerns of its citizens. As our community continues to grow with infrastructure and housing we are losing what little bit of green space we have left. Protect our parks, protect our children, and protect our neighbourhoods. I appreciate you taking the time to read my concerns and I hope to read soon that you have found a more appropriate site.
