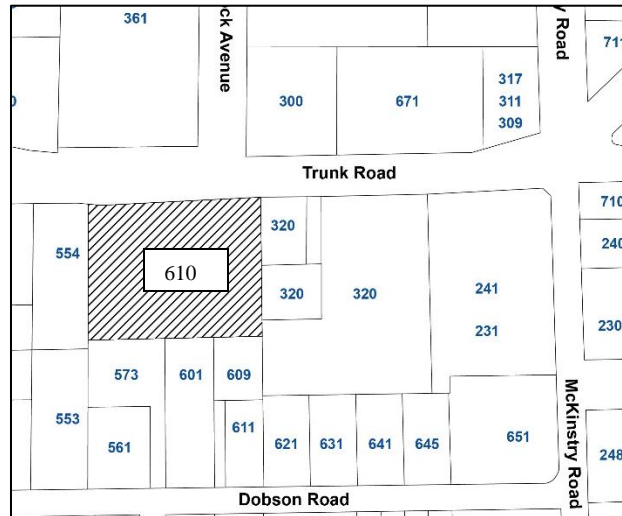




NOTICE OF NEW TEMPORARY USE PERMIT – 610 TRUNK ROAD

City of Duncan Council will consider issuing a new Temporary Use Permit (TUP) for LOT A, SECTION 16, RANGE 7, QUAMICHAN DISTRICT, PLAN VIP58624, located at 610 Trunk Road, Duncan, BC.



What is the purpose of the Temporary Use Permit?

The City has received an application to issue a new TUP to authorize the continued use of the subject property for temporary accommodation of up to 34 unsheltered persons in up to 34 modular sleeping units (cabins). The original TUP, including one renewal, was valid for a period of 16 months from January 15, 2022, to May 30, 2023. The proposed new TUP, if issued, would be valid for an 18-month term from May 30, 2023, to November 30, 2024.

The proposed TUP will be available for public review from Monday, May 1, 2023, to Monday, May 15, 2023, at City Hall, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday to Friday (excluding holidays), and on the City's website, www.duncan.ca.
